**Heroes**

A recent Peanuts Classic strip has Charlie Brown mourning his favorite baseball player who has been sent down to the minors. A sympathetic Violet responds, “Your hero had feet of clay, huh?” While it is a slight mix of metaphors, Violet’s comment sums up the Jewish view of standard heroes. Actually, it is charitable.



Scripture has a book devoted to heroes; the Book of Judges. Each one, while militarily successful, has a defect which renders his or her success temporary at best. The Hercules of the book, Samson, is the most ridiculous. He is clumsy, unintelligent, amoral, acting in ways that are, for the most part, counterproductive. This is from a culture that expects war and appreciates the warrior. The two major heroic figures of Scripture, Moses and David, are remembered in our tradition less for their mighty deeds than for their other achievements. Both are divinely punished for their less admirable aspects.

Perhaps the most profound statement about heroes is found in the second blessing of the *Amidah*. That blessing begins “ – אַתָּה גִבּוֹר לְעוֹלָם – You, Lord, are the eternal hero.” It is rarely translated that way, but that is what it means. The blessing goes on to enumerate God’s heroic actions; showing mercy, supporting the falling, healing the sick, and freeing the captive as well as being the hope for the dead. For the most part, these are mundane actions in which every Jew—perhaps every person—should be engaged.

This is the secret of the Jewish view of heroism. For most parts of our contemporary society the hero reflects our urge to transcend our human condition and somehow become superhuman.

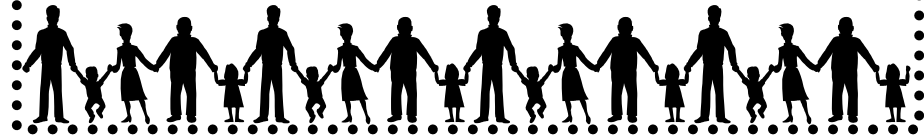
